Placement of Image

Trainer

- 1) Open the Trainer Image in Krita
- 2) Rename the layer Trainer.
- 3) Copy and Paste a suitable image onto the Trainer from the internet.
- 4) Reduce the opacity of the image.
- 5) Resize and position the image over part of the trainer.





Resize the image if necessary (CTRL T or 🔄

Copy Selection

6) Select the layer containing the new image and rename.

7) Use the Selection Tool shown below and select around the image you would like to place in trainer.





Black & White

8) Copy and paste the selection which will create a new layer.

9) Hide the middle layer to see your selection.



10) **Delete** the middle layer by selecting it and clicking on the Bin lcon.

11) Click on Select >> Deselect





Opacity

12) Decrease the opacity level of the Homer S layer to 40%.

13) Merge the Homer S layer with the Trainer layer.

Press CTRL to select both layers >> Right Click >> Merge with Layer Below



Brush Tools

14) The Brush Tool can also be used to edit parts of the trainer. You first need to make a selection and then copy and paste the selection to create a new layer.





Brush Tools

15) Select the Brush Tool

16) Edit the brush settings including type, size and opacity.17) Select Brush colour.



Brush Tools

18) Colour in part of the trainer with your brush tool. You can change the brush colour, type or size if you want to.

19) Merge the two layers into one.
